The suggested range numbers serve as a guideline. (An administrative guideline gives recommendations, interpretations, administrative instructions, best practice guidance, or frameworks in which to operate. Guidelines are informational, not mandatory. Like procedures, guidelines may change frequently depending on the organization's needs.) Class make up will factor into the additional support options selected, as well as the time of year that the class size exceeded the suggested range. Considerations: English Language Learners, Special Education, Socio-Economic factors, behavioral needs, health needs.

## **Additional Support Menu of options**

- A. Hiring a part time instructional aide
- B. Assigning Teachers' Assistant
- C. Hiring Substitutes for testing days
- D. Extra Bomber Time pull out or push in (if student needs emerge)
- E. Extra instructional programs that aid in differentiation or help support the teacher
- F. Structured parent volunteers
- G. Purchase additional organizational materials
- H. Supply additional technology
- I. As a last resort, a combination classroom can be considered

When class sizes reach the suggested additional support range, the principal will create a team to look at the needs of the classroom and select the best support(s) option(s) for students.

Suggested members of the problem solving team: building principal, classroom teachers, interventionist, special area teachers, pupil services, special education, superintendent.

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
